

Principal's Message

Dear Magee Secondary School students, staff, and parents,

As we make our way toward the end of another school year we have all kinds of news to celebrate! Inside this newsletter you will find a rich array of information updates highlighting learning opportunities that were provided to Magee students both inside and outside of the classroom over the past three months.

Our school's growth plan goals place a strong emphasis on increasing student engagement, initiative and leadership within a culture of care and support. Our growth plan objectives provide the impetus for the many examples of student success at Magee.



April ...

- Three Magee students participated in a Sustainability Workshop at UBC's Centre for Interactive Research on Sustainability (CIRS) alongside 47 other students from across the district. This workshop was the first of its kind where secondary school students got to meet with and learn from university researchers about landscape visualization, urban development, renewable energy technologies and systems and green building design, all within the context of sustainability - the greenest building on this continent. A wrap-up session at the end of the

workshop had students work in groups to discuss lessons learned and how they could apply this knowledge back in their schools.

- Magee's Environment Club held an exciting series of activities for our school community titled "Earth Week", which took place over the course of the week leading up to Earth Day. The themes our Environment Club chose for each day were: Monday - Water Awareness Day, Tuesday - Garden and Compost Day, Wednesday - Wasteless Wednesday, and Thursday featured an international key note speaker opportunity with Jeff Gibbs, a world-renowned photographer and global environment enthusiast who empowers students worldwide to protect our planet.
- Grade 12 students, Miranda Wang and Jeanny Yao, won the \$3,500 Regional BioGENEius Challenge for their innovative research on plastics. Their work identified soil bacteria from the Fraser River estuary that can naturally break down phthalates, a fossil fuel-based additive found in some plastic, which one day might help solve the problem of dealing with household and industrial plastic waste. Our two students received generous mentoring support from Professor Lindsay Eltis from UBC's Departments of Microbiology and Biochemistry, and two of his graduate students.



May ...

- Grade 12 student, Aaron Wong, led a "One Match Stem Cell Campaign" for a second year in a row at Magee. His stem cell donor awareness campaign is driven by a close friend who is in urgent need of stem cells. This year's stem cell registration event at the school drew in over 100 participants.
- Magee's spring musical production of "Urinetown" delighted audience members over six nights of performances. This eagerly anticipated annual event showcased our theatre students' tremendous talents and new levels of excellence within our school's remarkable theatre program. Audience members left with a level of excitement about what possibilities exist for next year's performance!
- We held a very successful Grade 7 Open House inviting incoming Grade 8 students, Grads of 2017, to experience high school life through a variety of events. Thanks to our Grade 12 Peer Counsellors for leading this very successful morning!
- Twenty Visual Arts students went on a unique Field Studies trip to New York City to expand their art studies on an international scale visiting Art Museums, Galleries, and landmark architectural sites.
- Student Council elections took place and we welcomed in Michael Fishman, as our 2012/2013 Student Council President.
- As Spring Season Athletic programs wrapped-up, Magee's

Senior Girls Soccer Team achieved a first place finish in the City Championships, as did our Badminton Team which went on to finish 9th overall in the province. Our Tennis Team competed all the way through to a 2nd place overall finish in the Provincial Championships. Congratulations, Magee Lions - you make us proud of your goal setting, team accomplishments, and leadership in the greater Vancouver community!

- On Thursday May 31st a historic concert took place at Magee. Ninety-four year old legendary local band leader, Dal Richards returned to the school to lead the school band that he founded as a Magee student in 1934. Guinness Board Chair Jimmy Pattison was on hand to present Dal with an official Guinness World Record that night for "longest lapsed time between performances by a high school band leader – 75 years!" This event helped to kick-off the two-year countdown to our school's May 2014 centennial celebration. - Two classes of senior Art students joined 250 False Creek Elementary students to paint a series of large murals at False Creek Elementary. Each Magee Art student was responsible for realizing a portion of the mural and supervising the contributions of the elementary school students.

Music Department

As another inspiring music year comes to a close, I would like to thank all our students, parents, Magee Music Society, teachers, admin, and my colleague Mr. Quan for a very successful year. Our April was busy with concerts and tours that included a combined pre-tour concert that included two bands from Hamber as well as two senior Magee bands. On the first major tour in April, the Chamber Choir, Senior Strings and Wind Ensemble toured to Seattle and Portland to take part in school and public performance concerts, attend the Seattle Symphony, Cirque du Soleil, and to receive workshops from the music professors at the University of Washington. On April 17, the Ad Mare Wind Quintet performed their annual concert for the grade 9 band. On April 18, Magee chamber ensembles: flute, clarinet, and wind quintet, under the direction of student teacher Jessica da Silva performed at the art show. The very next day, the Symphonic Band headed off for five days to Kelowna and Banff to perform at Okanagan Mission Secondary School and to take part in the Rocky Mountain

Music Festival. The final tour was a small retreat to Whistler on May 4-6 with the grade 9 band and special guest conductor Bryan Knapp.

Our Spring Concerts on May 29 and 30 this year showcased the wonderful talents of our current students. However, on May 31, Magee welcomed the return of one of its most famous musical graduates. Tenor Saxophonist, singer and band leader Dal Richards (grad of '37) returned to Magee at age 94 to conduct the Sr. Jazz Band and receive a Guinness Book of World Records award for "longest lapsed time between performances by a high school band leader – 75 years." The sold-out evening, a fundraiser for the 2014 Magee Centennial Celebration, was a celebration of Dal's achievements and a showcase for our current Magee students. Dal was given the award by noted BC businessman Jimmy Pattison and a representative from the Guinness office in New York.

The year ended with a free lunchtime concert by John Korsrud's Hard Rubber Orchestra. In addition, our grad band provided wonderful music for the awards assembly and the graduation ceremony. As we set our sights on a senior tour to Spain next spring, I thank the students for their hard work and commitment to excellence. SWIS Worker

The SWIS (Settlement Workers In Schools) Program at Magee and the SACY Program jointly hosted a series of parent workshops on "Building Bridges With Your Teen" in October 2011. All four sessions were well attended with more than thirty parents at each session.

The SWIS Program at Magee also provided outreach at the Kerrisdale Community Centre for parents and community members through a series of educational workshops during the past three months on "Gambling Awareness in BC-

Problem Gambling” in April. This was held in collaboration with BC Responsible and Problem Gambling Program, Ministry of Justice. The BC Secondary School System workshop was co-hosted with the Magee Multicultural Liaison Worker in May. The last workshop of the school year took place in June with Tony Bulic, Coordinator of the Kerrisdale Oakridge Marpole Community Policing Centre as speaker to touch on the topic of “Crime Prevention – Community Safety” for parents and community members.

The SWIS Welcome Club is planned to run from October 2012 to June 2013 for parents, students, and families. Meetings will be held weekly, during which Magee Settlement Worker Elisabeth Chan (a certified Information & Referral

Specialist) will provide information and referral about the education system as well as social, community and government services available. She can also assist in filling out forms such as: SIN, MSP, CCTB etc. and will provide accompaniment to and advocacy for the needed programs or services for New Canadians and eligible clients. Additional facilitation in communication in French, Cantonese and Mandarin is also available.

- ESL/ELL Program – Secondary (11th September, 2012)
- BC Elementary School System (9th October, 2012)
- VSB alternative programs and

services available for elementary school students (13th November, 2012)
